Neighborhood Texture Collage

Collect a variety of objects with interesting textures from around your neighborhood such as pieces of bark, pebbles, papers, etc. Pay special attention to their color and shape. Arrange these objects on a sheet of cardboard or any strong surface and glue them into a dynamic composition.
